



01.07.1858

Carl Hartwig, a citizen of the Grand Duchy of Poznań and inhabitant of Poznań, registers his tannery.

After 21 years of running the company Carl Hartwig dies. The business is taken over by his enterprising wife and managed by experienced proxies August Dittrich and Edward Hampel (later the company's owners). It still operates under the name of C. HARTWIG which is already known both domestically and abroad.


1905

The company celebrates its 50th anniversary. Dynamically developing, it occupies a dominant position on the market.



1911

C.Hartwig is awarded a number of medals by the City of Poznań for its accomplishments in the development of the city and outstanding service of the prestigious industrial exhibition.



1918

The Polish state acquires C.HARTWIG.

1919

In addition to branches already operating in Warsaw, Kraków, Katowice and Lwów, a new branch is established in Gdańsk.



1926

The dynamic development of Gdynia led the company to open another branch here in November 15, 1926.

1928

On the 70th anniversary of its establishment, C.Hartwig becomes the sole forwarder for the Poznań Fair, established in 1921.

1939

The founding of PSA Transport, the sole representative of C.Hartwig in the United Kingdom.

1945

After the end of World War II, Antoni Weselik, a long-time employee of the company, registers a company under the former name of C. HARTWIG SA Branch in Poznań.

1950

From the 1st of January 1950, by the decree of the Economic Committee of the Council of Ministers, C.Hartwig becomes the sole international forwarding company in Poland.



1953

C.Hartwig's offices are transformed into 5 branches, which after 1989 become independent companies.



1972

Establishment of a subsidiary company in Germany under the name of Poltrans.

1975

The founding of Amerpol, another subsidiary company, this time in New York.



2002

Takeover of C.Hartwig Gdansk.



2014

OT Logistics SA becomes the major shareholder of C.Hartwig Gdynia S.A.

2015

The company's headquarters move to a new modern building in the center of Gdynia at Śląska 47 Street.



2016

Takeover of Sealand Logistics.
